Elevating Success UK was established on the 23rd November 2007 with the aim of providing training and personal development to individuals within South London. Elevating Success UK now works with over 1,500 people per year consisting of children, young people and adults, across South London.

We have six main areas that we focus on:

- Community Development
- Personal Development
- Event Management
- Rehabilitating Offenders

- We aim to provide assistance and partnership support to regenerate priority areas and develop sustainable communities.

OBJECTIVES

To deliver training and educational programmes that are recognised as high quality, achieve the best value for money in all activities; develop links with businesses so that disadvantaged people have the chance to try activities and projects appropriately.

Our programmes are free at the point of access with our end users drawn from areas of high deprivation across London, be they children, teenagers or young adults, or senior citizens. We champion partnership working and have nurtured a number of valuable business relationships, mainly due to our fantastic team of employees and volunteers who share our vision and are committed to delivering our services to a very high standard.

Our multiple funding streams include housing associations, local authorities, youth offending and probation services, and training providers, as well as larger charities whose common aim is to build community participation.

A NEW BEGINNING

In September 2015, Elevating Success UK started a new chapter by moving from Croydon to Brockley, Lewisham.

This move was necessitated by the sale of our previous premises in Croydon. We were lucky enough to find a new venue in Brockley and made our move on 3rd September 2015.


Our initial months in the building were spent familiarising ourselves with the area and identifying local amenities and potential referral partners. As for the new office space it is more spacious than that of the last allowing for the whole team to work in a single space and share ideas on the fly. In addition we have the benefit of a large training room with outside space and dedicated parking for staff and visitors alike.

We spent the remainder of 2015 integrating into our surroundings, introducing ourselves to the local community and trying to get an idea of what was needed and wanted.

In January 2016, we delivered our first programme from our new venue, which proved to be a success. And as we approached the end of our financial year we had planned a great many activities and projects for the local community.

We are looking to launch Girls' Night In and Boys' Night In projects, as well as a Family Forum so we can really find out what local people want. In continued efforts to engage the local community we are planning a community event in the form of a BBQ where we will meet our neighbours and inform them of our services.

Our long-term plan is to establish a positive reputation in the area, as we did in Croydon. We want people to know we are here and to come to us when they require assistance.



We have already sought help from some of our local partners with established reputations in the local area. Ann-Marie Douglas from Rushey Green JobCentre Plus and Delphine Duff from London CRC have welcomed us to the area, as have our partners in our new venue, Clyde Early Childhood Centre.

KEY FIGURES AND FACTS FOR 2015/16

From April 2015 to March 2016, 33 individuals received an accredited qualification through our Pathway to Work in Construction and Pathway to Work in Catering & Hospitality programmes.

CEO AND CHAIRPERSON REPORTS

ANDREW BROWN - CEO

The last 12 months have been typified by the word change. We've relocated office from Croydon to Lewisham – a borough in which we have always delivered training. In fact, our first ever contract was secured in this borough – but there's little time for nostalgia as I'm sure it comes as no surprise to learn that the funding landscape has changed considerably in recent months. In fact, as the needs of our end users grow exponentially the resources to service those needs become scarcer.

However, there is truth in the saying that necessity is the mother of invention because that's what we've done. In January 2016 we launched the Pathway to Work in Catering & Hospitality course as we recognised that there was a shortage of suitably trained individuals to take up employment within the retail food and hospitality sectors. At the point of writing this we've delivered two cohorts to the employment market and the interest for the course remains constant.

Looking forward we've recognised that there is a need to support mothers who want to return to work. As ever the matter of insufficient or expensive childcare remains a barrier for many and so we're turning our focus on how we can support mothers in to business – that's self-employment that will provide them with the flexibility to remain economically active and at the heart of the childcare they deliver to their children.

The second theme in our 'pipeline' is the prospect of developing an accredited retail course. As a team that supports candidates to apply for jobs online we've seen how high the bar has been raised in terms of qualifying for this work. No experience sometimes means 'no chance' and we're looking at ways in which we can give our candidates the edge. So to use a sailing analogy, I remain at the helm of the Elevating Success ship, the waters are choppy, but

VANESSA CLARKE - CHAIRPERSON

Elevating Success UK has completed another successful year delivering its key and accredited projects: Pathway to Work in Construction with 67% of the attendees entering work as a result of this training; the On the Road Programme with 22 passing their Driving Theory Test; together with the High-5 Employability Skills Programmes through which we have seen 30 people go on to find employment.

The Lewisham and Momentum Youth Conferences were held this year were very successful with over 2,000 attendees from across London.

The current economic climate continues to present its challenges however, the Board are confident that Elevating Success UK will continue to grow with our thanks to Andrew Brown, CEO, for his vision, diligence, leadership and networking skills that has resulted in further expansion within this year.

We have been fortunate to have a Board of Trustees with great and varied experience, quality and ability and this year we welcomed a new member, Ann-Marie Nicholls, who joined the Board and whose son has utilised Elevating Success UK's Services.

The Trustees would also like to take this opportunity to thank our funders for their continued support through this year. The Momentum Youth Conference 2015 was attended by over 950 young people aged 11 to 19 years and represented the partnership work of 14 organisations who came together to make it possible for event organiser Elevating Success, to plan and deliver this statement event.

Alongside the entertainment there was a variety of workshops to participate in, accompanied by over 40 stalls promoting activities and opportunities ranging from the cadets and arts-based providers to local employers offering apprenticeships.

Hosted by comedians Remel London and Kae Kurd and attended by dignitaries including the Mayor of Croydon and Croydon's borough Commander the aim of the event was to empower young people in and around London.

Measuring the impact that the event had on young lives was key to evaluating the success of the event. Attendees were called three weeks after the event to establish the lasting impact and it was warming to learn that some had been so inspired by the motivational speakers that that had taken breaks from social media in order to reduce distractions and focus on their goals, while others have developed the confidence to be able to 'stand out from the crowd' with small acts like putting their hand up on class.

One funder said of the event:

"Investing in projects that support communities and improve people's life chances is an important aspect of the work we do and to be a valued member of this group enables us to impact young people from all over London."

PATHWAY TO EMPLOYMENT 2015

Over the last 12 months we ran a project in partnership with the Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) and Catford and Forest Hill JCPs. We ran six programmes over the 12-month period.

Five of these six programmes were On The Road: Driving Theory Programmes. We engaged with 48 individuals on these five courses.

Of these 48 individuals, 40 of them graduated. Over 50% of graduates passed their Driving Theory Test and 17 went on to gain employment.

We also delivered one Pathway to Work in Construction Programme working with 12 individuals: 10 of whom went on to gain a Level One Qualification in Health & Safety in a Construction Environment, the industry-recognised qualification typically required by employers within large building contractor firms.

Of the 10 graduates who gained a qualification, eight went on to pass their CSCS Health & Safety Exams and gain a CSCS Card. Three of these found full-time employment within the construction industry.







AMICUSHORIZON PROJECTS

HOMEWORK CLUB

After six successful years under Elevating Success' stewardship the decision was made to close the Homework Club. In its final four months from September 2015 we attracted 15 individuals of whom six had been coming since the Homework Club first began.

While it was sad to see the cessation of this project we have shared many successes over its lifespan.

Some of these successes include seeing the development of the young attendees over time, be it educational attainment, emotional resilience or leadership skills.

While the Homework Club came to an end in December 2015, many of the attendees still remain part of the Elevating Success 'family' and have joined our Youth Forums, Girls' Night In Project and holiday programmes. As one door has closed many more remain open for these young people and we look forward to working with them for a long time yet.

REGIONAL YOUTH FORUM

After doubling in size during the previous 12 months, this year saw the Youth Forum continue steadily.

The motto of the Youth Forum is 'your voice, our voice' which demonstrates the unity of all young people involved.

The aim of the forum is to engage the young people from our contact areas — Bramcote, Croydon, Lansdowne Green and Tulse Hill — and promote activities that develop skills that they might not otherwise have acquired.

As such forum members have taken part in various activities including the Duke of Edinburgh Award—focused primarily upon developing competences in a number of outdoor activities.

The forum also attended its annual Residential, this time heading to Wales that incorporated teambuilding events.

It has been great to see each member of the Regional Youth Forum grow into functioning members of their communities.

GIRLS' NIGHT IN

Girls' Night In is a monthly meeting of young women, who come together and talk about issues that they face in a safe, confidential and friendly environment. Topics effecting young people are raised by the young people, giving them the opportunity to discuss them with females who have gone through the same issues.

The peer mentoring aspect of the project puts the girls at ease and enables them to feel safe.

This year saw us progress our anti-bullying campaign, which was requested by a young member of Girls' Night In who lost a friend as a result of bullying.

Headed into the 2016/17 year, we aim to launch our Girls' Night In project in Brockley.



CCHA SCHOOL'S OUT PROGRAMME

During the summer of 2015, we delivered a School's Out Summer Programme in partnership with CCHA.

The programme was designed for young CCHA residents to experience activities that they might not have normally participated in. 36 individuals aged between seven and 14 attended three weeks of activities, including trips to Eagle Heights, The Olympic Parks, Brockwell Lido and Frylands Wood.

Joshua said:

"I really enjoyed all the activities, but my favourite was going to Painshill Park and learning about Orienteering. It was something I didn't know about before, but I learnt lots of new skills."

AMICUSHORIZON SUMMER PROGRAMMES

For the fourth year in a row, we ran two Summer Holiday Programmes in partnership with AmicusHorizon. These programmes ran in Croydon and Tulse Hill.

The programmes attracted 41 individuals who took part in onsite activities such as arts & crafts and sports, mixed with offsite trips to bowling alleys, cinemas and swimming pools.

Members of the Regional Youth Forum acted as volunteers for the programme, many of whom were attendees of previous AmicusHorizon Summer Programmes.

Elijah said:

"I have attended the programme for the last three years. Each year the programme gets better. I enjoy seeing the same people again and I've made plenty of new friends."



NORTH CROYDON SUMMER PROGRAMME

The North Croydon Summer Programme, running for the third consecutive year in partnership with PlayPlace Innov8.

The programme attracted 43 individuals. Of these 43, 21 had attended the North Croydon Summer Programme previously and a further eight have attended other Elevating Success UK Programmes in the past.

This project was facilitated by our experienced youth workers, and was assisted by a Spanish intern.

As usual, this programme culminated with the Addington Play Day, a big event where young people come together to take part in sports and other fun activities.

Jayden said:

The Lewisham Youth Conference 2016 was attended by over 500 people aged between 11 and 19 years old. Alongside the entertainment there was a variety of workshops to participate in, along with 35 information stalls promoting activities and opportunities.

The Youth Conference, hosted by comedian Tommy Xpensive, aimed to inspire and empower young people in and around Lewisham and south London.

The event was attended by the Vicky Foxcroft (MP), the Lewisham Young Mayor's Team, and some young entrepreneurs from the local area. Each gave a motivational speech that empowered and inspired the audience.

Lewisham Homes was the main sponsor for the event, with additional support from AmicusHorizon, Anglian Building Projects, Axis, Family Mosaic, Flames Radio, JobCentre Plus, Lewisham Council, London & Quadrant, Metropolitan Police and The Hyde Group.

We were fortunate to receive a large amount of feedback from the young people present at LYC 2016.

The event was deemed a huge success, with many calling it excellent.

The young people in attendance were of an extremely diverse age range. In attendance were junior school students, high school students, college students, university attendees and those already in the working world.

The fact that we received such overwhelming praise for the event from such a varied group of young people was extremely pleasing.

Feedback from the young attendees suggests that they found the event to be highly beneficial, inspirational and fun.



Our Outcomes for 2015/16

CASE STUDIES

EMMANUELLE'S CASE STUDY:

Having been unemployed for over 10 years Emmanuelle was ready for a change so when a JCP adviser at Rushey Green mentioned an upcoming course that promised entry into the catering and hospitality sector he jumped at an opportunity to secure a place.

Starting on 10th February 2016, the Pathway to Work in Catering & Hospitality course (PWICH) was delivered by training company Elevating Success UK. As a JCP-funded programme it had a strict eligibility criteria that targeted lone parents, Work Programme Completers and the over 50s. At 51 years young, Emmanuelle was eligible to start the programme and he (and 10 others) commenced training in early February and completed his studies on 4th March 2016.

"This course was an absolute Godsend." Emmanuelle says of his experience. "If you'd said to me you'd go on a course and you'd be working after – I'd have said 'no way'", but that is exactly what happened. A successful work placement as a Kitchen Assistant in the third week of the course led to a job offer as a Trainee Chef. On 22nd March 2016 Emmanuelle became a part of the catering team based at a primary school in Lewisham. Having spent years not feeling part of any team, he finally feels as though he belongs.

When you haven't worked for a long time you have the luxury of complaining. But when you're working you just have to pick yourself up and get on with it.

BENJAMIN'S CASE STUDY:

Having reviewed Elevating Success UK's website prior to the start of my six-week internship in April 2015 I still had no idea of what the business did - bar the fact it was a charity that helped people to develop their skills 'and maximise their full potential'.

I was very surprised to find a warm and friendly atmosphere and how fast I was integrated into the team. I worked with wonderful and various people.

Initially, it was very hard for me to understand and speak English because there were big differences between my school-English and the English spoken here. However, I was assigned a variety of tasks. I helped with the organisation of the Pathway to Work in Construction Programme, which enables people to work in the construction industry, many of whom now have a better chance of getting a job after the course. However, I was mainly responsible for managing the social media content for the Lewisham Youth Conference.

In this short time I've learned a lot, from how social media can be used to get new sponsors and people interested via Twitter or Facebook. I've been able to refresh skills I have - such as my design skills - but hadn't used for years as I modified some promotional event flyers. And I've learnt how much effort goes into organising an event like LYC.

Those were the highs, but there were times when the work was really chaotic because somebody gave you a task and then somebody else came and gave you another three!
